



Board & train pre-board questionnaire

Complete and email to marmstrong@woofworkstraining.com. Please answer the questions below truthfully because it will help us tailor a training plan that is right for you and your dog. We will schedule an in-person evaluation of your dog. If your dog qualifies for a board & train, you must provide proof of vaccination for rabies, kennel cough, and heartworm.

Please note that your dog must be crate trained and be able to settle in a crate to qualify as a board & train candidate. If not, we will schedule individual training sessions for crate training.

A board & train must be viewed as the beginning of your dog's training, even if he has had other formal training in the past. The intention of these is not to "fix" your dog, but rather start the training process of which you must take part in once the board & train has been completed. The skills we teach your dog can be lost if not maintained. Be prepared to spend several hours with our trainers and the financial cost for follow up training sessions.

14. Does your dog have any major health issues?
15. Have you ever considered surrendering your dog to a shelter, rescue, another family, etc.? If yes, why?
16. Do you consider the board & train a last-ditch effort to save your dog from being surrendered to a shelter, rescue, another family, etc.?
17. Please list the skills or behavioral changes you would like us to work on during the board & train?
18. Many of the skills we teach dogs require lots of physical movement such as bending, turning, quick starts and stops, etc. Do you have any major physical restrictions? We ask in order to adjust our training plan for your dog accordingly.

Board & trains require several hours of daily work with your dog. Our trainers are very committed to ensuring your dog's success, and you must be equally committed to that success. We will teach you many of our training techniques during follow up sessions, of which you will need to apply daily in some cases. Training is ongoing and should be a fun activity for you and your dog. If you consider this arduous or cannot commit to the necessary amount of time to training, then consider whether a board & train is worth the investment.
